
Hi Everyone,

(It is not the same as your password for the computers at college. Bksb passwords are either your first name then 123! or your first name 12345! for shorter names)

Now we all need to stay at home it is an opportunity to do some cooking and practice our Maths and measuring skills.




What measuring tools can you find at your home?
